KEY STATS

- Centrepoint estimates that £12 million could be saved by the Treasury just from the number of young people supported into more work, such as reduced social security spending, greater tax receipts and improved health and criminal justice outcomes.
- This issue limits the employment opportunities for over 30,000 young people in the UK.

KEY MESSAGES

- End the benefit trap
- Let 30,000 homeless young people work.
- Reduce the Housing Benefit taper rate from 65% to 55%.
- The benefit trap blocks ambition for homeless young people at the start of their careers.
- Young people in supported housing face a financial cliff edge when they start work
- Making Work Pay could move thousands into employment and save the government over £12 million per year.
- This benefit trap is a block on aspiration and creates a perverse incentive, effectively preventing young people from entering the workforce.
